### **RESEARCH INTERESTS**

I investigate how the workings of language can be made susceptible to discovery by learners. The linguistic phenomena that interest me most occupy the gap between dictionary items and grammar rules. This intermediate territory of partially productive lexico-grammatical constructions escapes conventional knowledge resources. Taking a distributional view of language, I assume that the identity of these fugitive units of language are constituted relationally. I investigate empirically the possibility that learning constructions by discovery entails recognizing these constituting relations. My collaborative work develops relational computational language models that capture these units and relations bottom up and render them discoverable by learners, teachers, and researchers (see [nav4.stringnet.org](http://nav4.stringnet.org) for example).
