


Structure of a Lesson Plan

1) Warm Up/ Review: 5 minutes

4 Sections & The 5–15–15–5 Rule

-get the kids lively & active
-preview what's following
-TPR, line games, hammer games
-time: keep it flexible







Structure of a Lesson Plan

2) New Materials: 15 minutes

-introduce new words
-review often (every 3 words)
-6-8 words is a good quantity to teach in a lesson
-learning the vocabulary in isolation NO
-teaching the vocabulary in questions/sentences YES

Structure of a Lesson Plan

3) Practice of new material: 15 minutes

-monotonic drill NO; drill – game integration YES
-the purpose > to practice the target language
-in different ways: TPR, line games, hammer games, rhymes/songs

4) Wrap Up & Goodbye

-games > a high > kids look forward to the next lesson -worksheet demo > a calm > reflection on what learned -goodbye



- 4 sections
- The 5-15-15-5 rule
- Quantity matters: 6-8 words per session
- Frequent reviews: every 3-4 words
- Fast paced, drill-game / teaching-game integration



FINCH - BIRD

G1 & G2

Essential Words: bird (animal), egg (food & drink), 0-9 (numbers)

G3 & G4

Essential Words: sing (*action words*), foot/feet, legs, head (*body parts*), white, red, blue, yellow (*colors*)

G5 & G6

-Essential Words (from G1-G4): bird, egg, color, blue, yellow, white, sing, foot/feet, legs, head -Essential Words: fly (*action words*) -Supplementary Words: beak, wings, feathers

Flamingo 📲

Flamingos are tall, mostly pink <u>birds</u> with long legs. A flamingo often stands with its long, thin neck curved into an *S* shape. Flamingos fly and feed in large flocks of hundreds to even millions of birds.

■ Like <u>storks</u>, <u>herons</u>, and <u>ibises</u>, flamingos are

wading birds. This means that they feed while standing or walking in shallow water. Flamingos live in warm regions near lakes and bodies of water called lagoons.

There are five species, or types, of flamingo. The most common type is the lesser flamingo. It is found mainly in eastern and southern Africa and India. Other types of flamingo come from Central and South America, Caribbean

islands, southern Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and southern Asia.

A flamingo has webbed feet, a slender body, large wings, and a short tail. Its head is small, and its bill curves downward. It stands between about 3 feet (almost 1 meter) and 5 feet (1.5 meters) tall.

Flamingos feed with their heads down in shallow water or mud. A flamingo's bill has a series of hairlike plates inside that act as a filter. The bird uses its bill to strain food from the water. Flamingos eat tiny living things such as algae and small animals such as shrimp and snails.
