Dear Freshmen,

Congratulations on your admission to the Department of English Language & Literature at Fu Jen Catholic University (FJCU)! As department chair, I'm writing to welcome you to your new home.

During your study here at FJCU, try to apply for a minor, a double major, and/or a cross-disciplinary program, and even grasp the opportunities to study abroad (such as joining the exchange programs). Develop your short-term and long-term goals and be flexible in making adjustment.

While enjoying your freedom in college and trying different activities, you learn to properly work on time management and develop relationships. Think of your priority and make balance of your academic, personal, and family life. Additionally, make exercise a habit to release pressure, and relax on vacation.
