
ENGLISH DEPARTMENT CURRICULUM - Overall Design (beginning with students entering in Fall 2024)



- 1. Students who meet both University and Department requirements and earn 128 credits are eligible for graduation.
- 2. The three components of the English Department Curriculum are designed to fulfill the Department Vision. (p.1)
 - The **Basic Language Courses** train students' English language, communication and presentation skills.
 - The <u>Basic Content (Language Studies and Literature) Courses</u> introduce students to literature in English, linguistics and Western civilization, while exploring their relevance to Taiwanese society.
 - The <u>Advanced Elective Courses</u> include senior "Professional Writing" courses, "Advanced Chinese" courses, and "Advanced Courses." <u>The Advanced Courses</u> (further divided into Advanced Literature and Culture, Advanced Language Studies and Professional Training) help students further develop their analytical thinking, values, and professional knowledge through the study of a major emphasis of their own choice. To establish a solid foundation in the humanities, students are required to complete a minimum of 3 credits in each of the categories of Advanced Literature and Culture and Advanced Language Studies, totaling at least 15 credits across these two categories.
- **3.** The department conducts all courses in English, led by highly specialized faculty members, both local and foreign, guiding students in a direct and thorough exploration of the English language and Western culture.
