
3.2 Department Curriculum (Overall Design)

(This curriculum applies to students who enrolled in the department beginning in Fall 2025.)



- 1. Students who meet both University and Department requirements and earn 128 credits are eligible for graduation.
- 2. The three components of the English Department Curriculum are designed to fulfill the Department Vision.
 - The <u>Basic Language Courses</u> train students' English language, communication and presentation skills.
 - The <u>Basic Content (Language Studies and Literature) Courses</u> introduce students to literature in English, linguistics and Western civilization, while exploring their relevance to Taiwanese society.
 - The <u>Advanced Elective Courses</u> include senior "Professional Writing" courses, "Advanced Chinese" courses, and "Advanced Courses." <u>The Advanced Courses</u> (further divided into *Advanced Literature and Culture, Advanced Language Studies* and *Professional Training*) help students further develop their analytical thinking, values, and professional knowledge through the study of a major emphasis of their own choice. To establish a solid foundation in the humanities, students are required to complete a minimum of <u>3 credits</u> in each of the categories of *Advanced Literature and Culture* and *Advanced Language Studies*, totaling at least 15 credits across these two categories.

3. The department conducts all courses in English, led by highly specialized faculty members, both local and foreign, guiding students in a direct and thorough exploration of the English language and Western culture.
