
As for the last motivation, we can introduce Fu Jen University we see through the story we record and this is what we have never done before so we would like to try. Therefore we embarked on our project.

#### 3. Difficulties

#### a. Time limit

We decided to join the competition on September 23<sup>rd</sup>. We had tight schedule that we need to finish all the work in a month. However, on October 15<sup>th</sup>, we accidentally decided to rewrite our stories. There were only two weeks left. Therefore, we divided both writing and photo shooting to all the four members. Fortunately, we finished all the work before the deadline.

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#### 4. Difficulties

#### a. Device Problem

First, we mainly used two different software to edit our clip. One is *PowerDirector* and the other one is *Window Movie Maker*. These software require very professional computer so they can run fluently. While editing the video, our computer kept lagging so we wasted much more time than we expected.

Secondly, the resolution of the camera we used to shoot the clip was not good enough so the scenes of the video are indistinct.

#### b. Technical Problem

First, none of us had been taught how to use video editing software professionally. Thus, we put a lot effort on learning the software and try every function as possible. Secondly, while shooting the video, we tried our best not to shake our hands. However, we failed to do

so. Therefore, as you can see, our video looks pretty amateur.

#### c. Time limit

We finally decided that we want to make the video as our second product. And the final was actually around the corner so everybody was all busy with our own tasks. It was really hard to gather every group member together to shoot the video.

#### 5. Possible improvement

As mentioned above, we mainly faced three difficulties. The device problem might be the biggest problems among all the obstacles. However, even thought we cannot buy qualified devices, we still can turn to others to ask for help and borrow them. As for the shaking scenes in the video, maybe we can use tripod to fix the camera.

We faced the technical problems as well. There was also a small problem that the faces of the casts were mostly cut off. It was because we found out that the scenes were terribly unstable, we use one function in Window Movie Maker to make it looks smoother. However, it turned that the software cut off the bottom and the upper part of the screen and somehow we cannot recover it.

To solve the time problem, I think we have to stick to the work plan and do not procrastinate anything so that we can finish everything without rush.



At the beginning of our project, we did not expect the major difference between our ideas and we did not have effective communication and reached consensus before actual writing. Also, we did not actually divide the work equally to share the pressure. Later, we were afraid that we would be unable to submit our work on time, so we shared the writing instead of letting Allen handle all of it. However, also at this time, there were some conflicts between the members. Therefore, on November 7<sup>th</sup> after the midterm, we had a meeting to express our feelings and exchange our opinions on the conflicts we had earlier.

Surprisingly, after this meeting, all of us found it more relaxing and comfortable when working with each other and it was easier for us to say our opinions immediately in the discussion. Thus, in the following teamwork, we had more effective communication in our meeting.



We may not agree each other's idea or opinions. However, to communicate is to reach consensus. By discussing with each other again and again, we tried to find something that would be acceptable for everyone. So we have done every scene-shooting in one afternoon. We spent 5 to 6 hours to film it. We were totally worn out at the last 2 hours. We have to record our process from summer to winter so we brought lot of clothes with us to change according to different scenes and this was the most tired part as well. And we tried to put the ice cream and big rocky buns into the film so we ate them while shooting. I had lots of fun.

I do not regret taking this course so early. Although I suffered under great pressure and face many difficulties, I overcame them and I learned. This is a priceless experience.

#### C. Verna's Reflection

Through the procedure of our team work, I have not only learned the writing skills but coordinating skills. #### D. Tina's Reflection

At first, I was hesitated to join the project because originally I quitted my part time job and planned to devote more time on my studies this semester. Nevertheless, when Verna came to ask me, I had a picture of how to create our work in my mind, which kept pushing me to join the project, so I did.

However, things did not go what I expected at the very beginning (I think all of us did). We had so many different opinions and so less of time. In our discussions, we tried hard to convince each other and persuaded each other. Sometimes we may succeed, and sometimes we may need to compromise and step back. After our discussions, I often felt exhausted, or even confused or depressed. However, also because of those increasing negative emotion, it dawned on us that we had to speak out our true feelings to each other. Otherwise, we can not put our work further. In that "confessing meeting," it was surprised for me to find that I did feel better when telling what I really feel and hearing responses from others. Also, it became easier for us to work in the following stages and I found our discussions more joyful. Though there were still some conflicts happening between us, we then learned to speak it out instantly and solved it right away.

Nevertheless, I learned something new from our working process but unsatisfied with our products. We did have some good ideas but fail to carry them out and show it in our final products. First, we really lacked time not only because of the tight deadline of work submission but also because of our heavy work load of school work in sophomore year. Second, though we had set up work plan, we did not really follow it and kept delaying. Though we did not reach our initial goal, I hope that in the future we may still discover those unknown and meaningful stories in Fu Jen and let more people find the beauty in Fu-Jen people and on campus.
