


Book Title: Peggy's Ordinary Day





Then, she plays with her toys.




Miss, you egg is almost done. Just a minute! She also reads a book about her favorite character—Maisy.

I hope I can get a yellow one on my BIRTHDAY.


Beep.

What about having a pudding? I have wanted to eat it since this afternoon.




However, she knows that it's almost the time.
