3. Strengthen the collaboration with SVC and Guo-Tai groups to learn and grow together as global citizens.

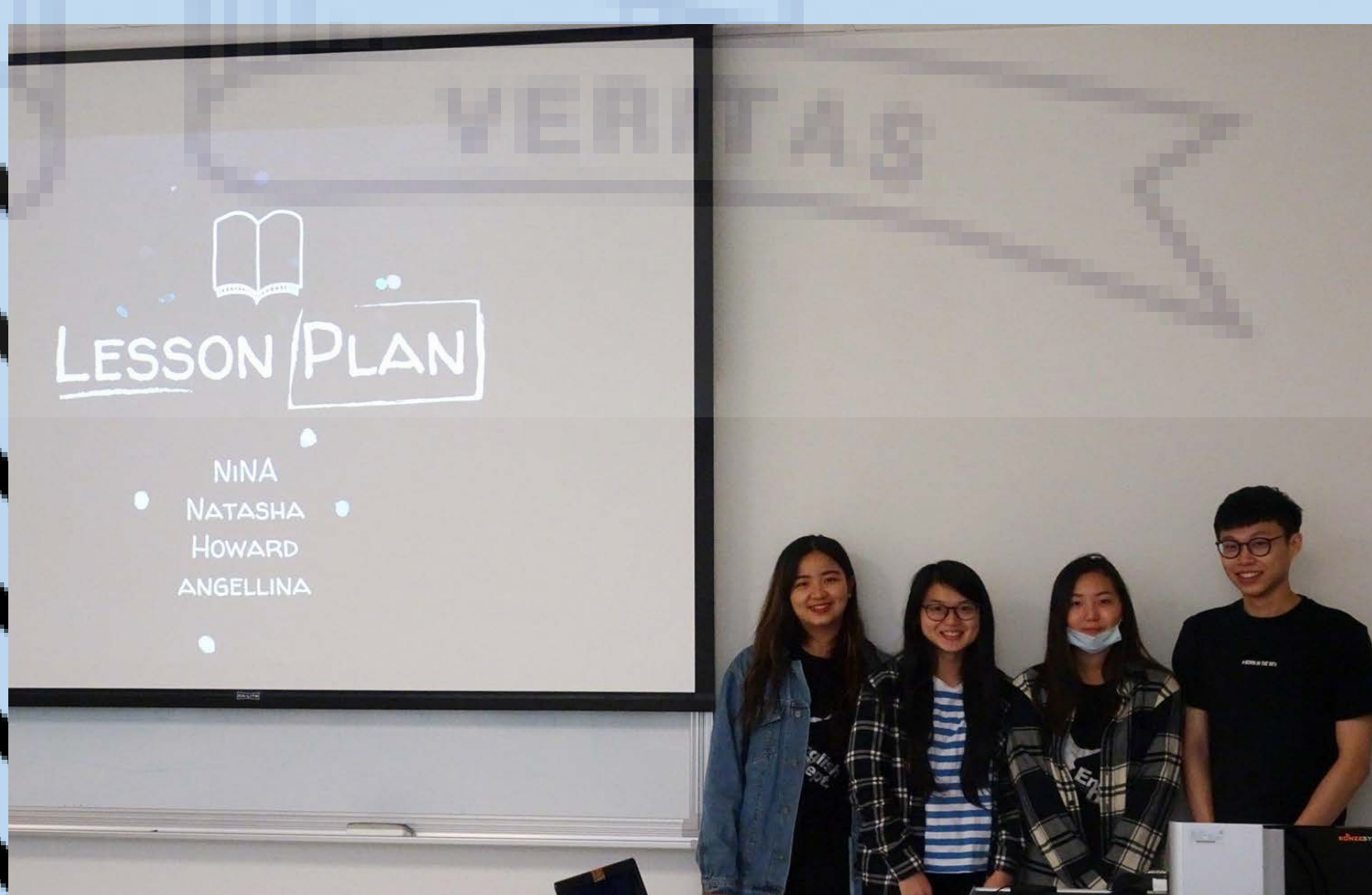

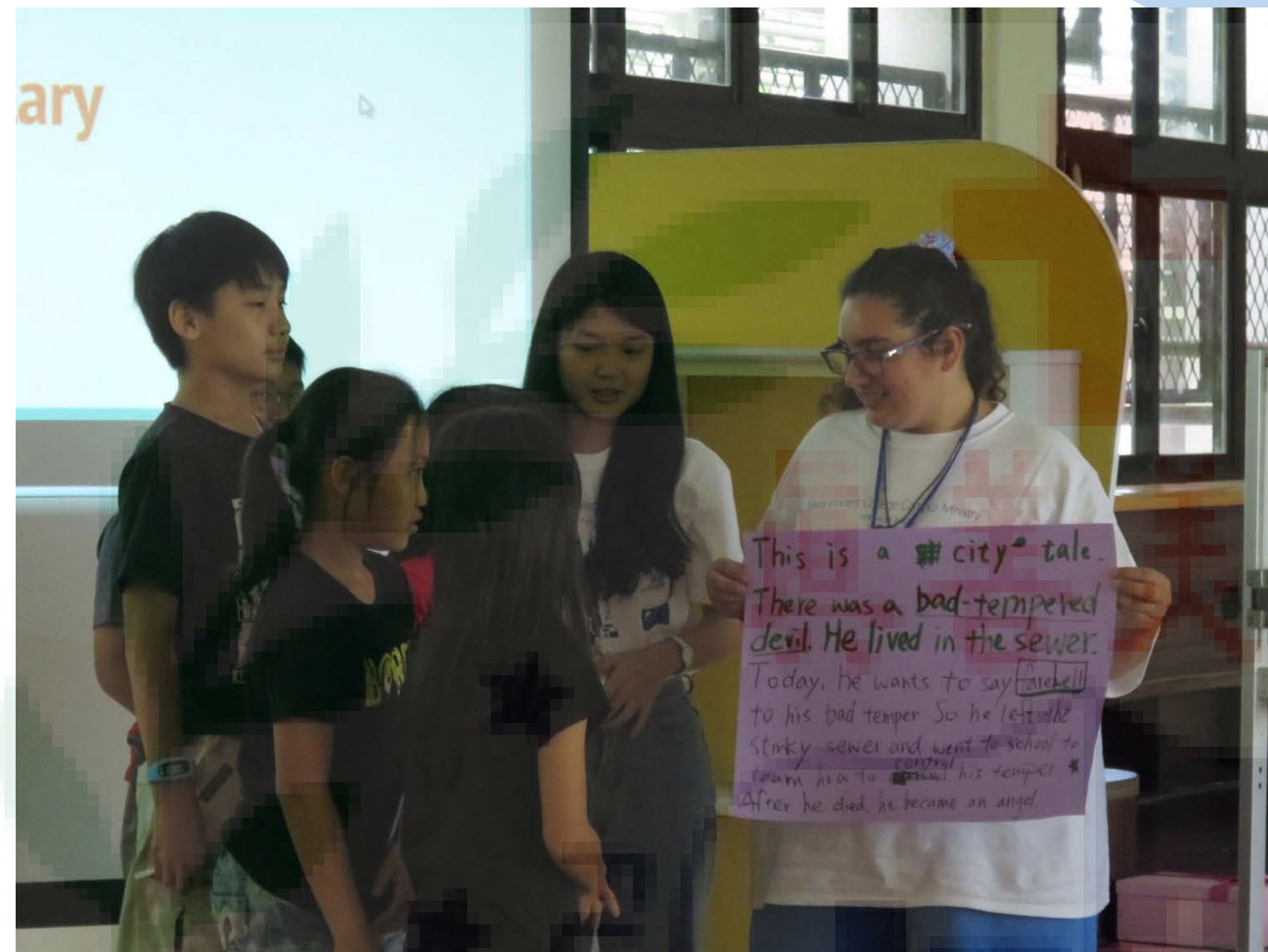
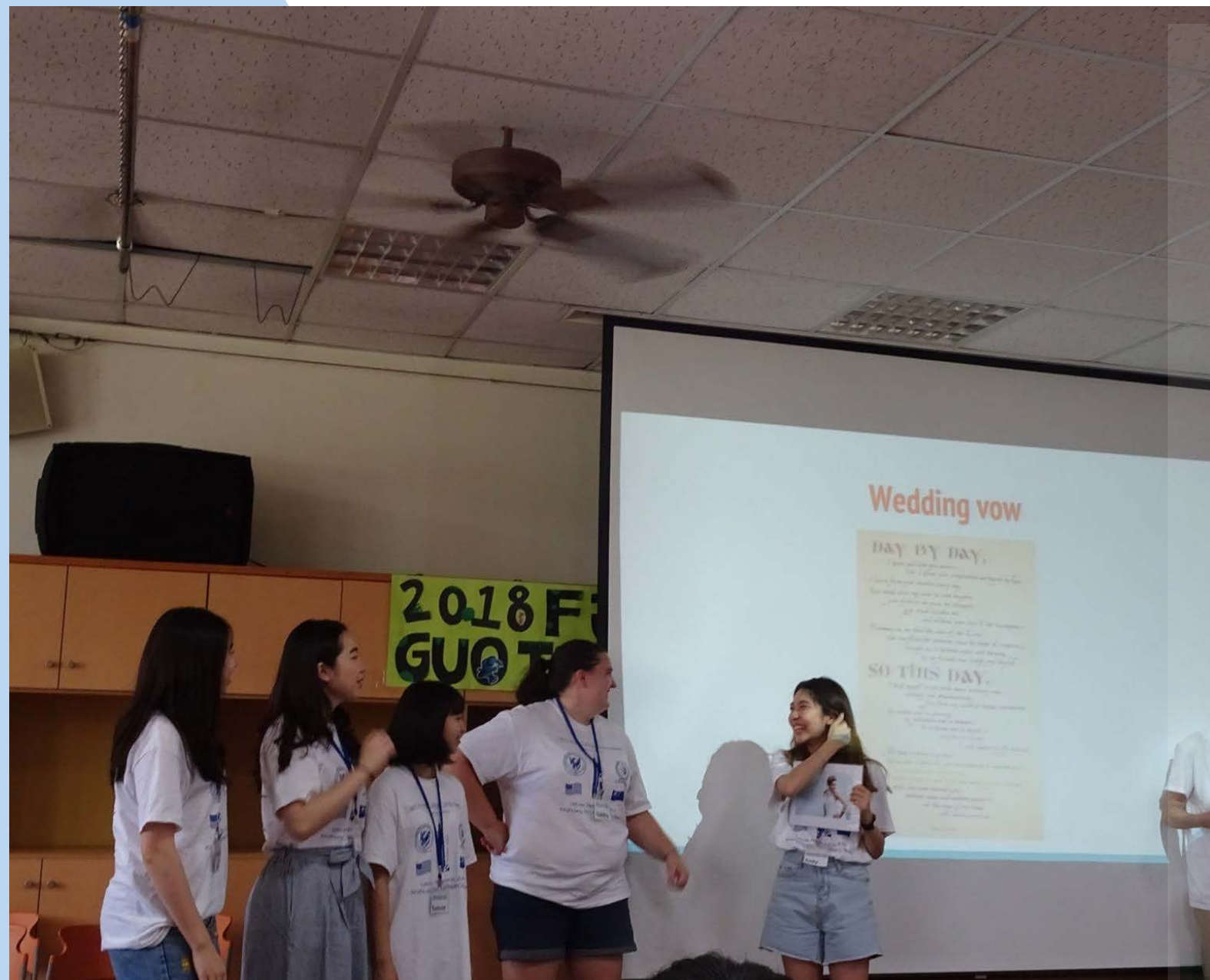
