
## ENGLISH DEPARTMENT CURRICULUM - Overall Design (beginning with students entering Fall 2014)



- 1. The students who fulfill the University and Department requirements and acquire 128 credits are qualified for graduation.
- 2. The three components of the English Department Curriculum are designed to carry out the Department Vision. (p.1)
  - The **Basic Language Courses** train students' English language, communication and presentation skills.
  - The <u>Basic Content (Language Studies and Literature) Courses</u> introduce students to literature in English, linguistics and Western civilization in relation to Taiwanese society.
  - The <u>Advanced Elective Courses</u> include senior "Professional Writing" courses, "Advanced Chinese" courses, and "Advanced Courses." <u>The Advanced Courses</u> (further divided into <u>Advanced Literature</u>, <u>Advanced Language Studies and Professional Training</u>) help students further develop their analytical thinking, values, and professional knowledge through the study of a major emphasis of their own choice. To lay a firm foundation in the humanities, students are required to take at least 3 credits <u>respectively</u> from the categories of <u>Advanced Literature</u> and <u>Advanced Language Studies</u>, and altogether 15 credits from the two above-mentioned categories.
- 3. Instruction in English by the high percentage of foreign professors and highly proficient local professors provides direct, intensive exposure to English and to Western culture.
